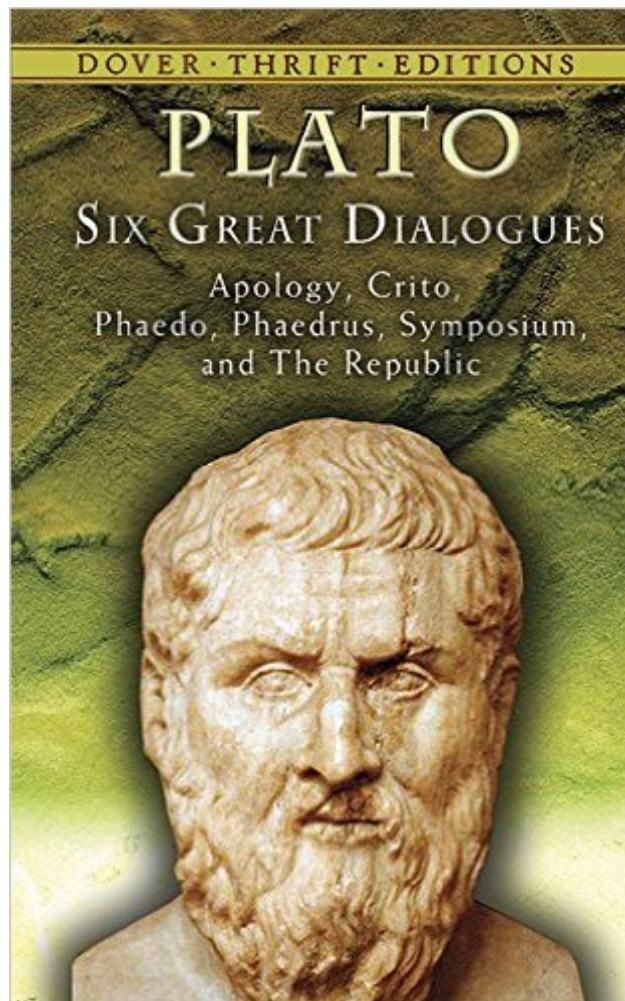

It is small enough to carry with me in my purse or book bag. It is, sadly, paperback, which means I've already torn the cover slightly, but that is what always happens with paperbacks for me.

Tough to get through but very good. Socrates and Plato are ones that pushed into existence western philosophy. This book's translation makes easy some difficult scenes in the books. It is a very slow read, but if you are into philosophy, it is a must.

I purchased this edition and found it very nicely written. The compilation of work is organized and easy to read. I received it promptly and it was packaged very well as to prevent damage to the book. I would recommend this to anyone.

It is UNABRIDGED version. Thus, you may expect that most of the pages are attributed to The Republic. The translator, Benjamin Jowett, which is also famous, has his wiki page and you may want to take a look. The only drawback is that the paper quality is mediocre, and it seems as cheap as the "popular" books you can find in a supermarket. The advantage is that it is light and easy to carry.
